Methodist Connections

- Missionaries from the Methodist church were in Brazil starting with the end of the USA Civil War.
- Our former Dean's grandfather, uncle, and father were well-known Methodist missionaries in Brazil.
- His family helped create and was still a part of a strong and important church-related private educational system in Brazil that allowed us to make this connection.

Initial Connections

- Administrators and teachers from the Methodist schools came to Emory & Henry for summer study.
- Students from these schools followed for five years after this.
- We selected and sent three of our students there to teach and be representatives of the United Sates and native English language users. We did this for five years.

Successful Program, But . . .

Worked with schools in Lins, UNIMEP University, and the University of Sau Paulo.

Program ended due to lack of support when Dean with Brazil connection resigned.

Success for Several Years

Bump in the Road

REBIRTH

- Dr. Marvin Reynolds, alumnus and donor, was a benefactor to the dental school in Lins, and he wanted us to reconnect with schools there.
- We in the Neff Center, along with our former Dean, now a professor of religion, also wanted to reestablish our program in Brazil.
- Our new President and new Dean supported this effort.

New Chapter in Program

- We developed a new selection process.
- We sent two students the first year, one from religion and one from psychology.
- We sent four last year, including one of our M.A. graduates in Reading as a supervisor. The other three were teacher preparation students.




Brazil Travelers 2007 and 2008



2008 Update

- We sent two this year, 2008
- Dr. Reynolds pays for the plane tickets, and the Neff Center assists if we have the budget. Room and Board is provided by the schools in Lins, so other than personal, incidental expenses, this experience costs the students nothing.
- In-country travel to places like Rio and Igausu are provided by the hosts if possible.





Problems

- A different school-year schedule causes problems regarding when we send students.
- Airport transfers can be tricky for non-native speakers. Also, at this point, you cannot purchase electronic tickets for Brazil incountry flights in the United States, so this can cause problems.
- Visas for Brazil are a challenge.

 Copy of Itinerary—accompanying plane ticket printout is helpful here
 Letters from both schools, sending and receiving, describing the nature of the exchange and the schools responsibility for the students.
 Security clearance check—Our local sheriff's department takes care of this for us
 Bank statement from either the student or the parents of the students demonstrating that the individual going to Brazil have resources, i.e., that they are not indigent. Clarity of the schools' responsibilities for the students needs and welfare is helpful here.
